



2024 was a very rewarding year as we saw tangible fruits from some of LAF's long-term, strategic investments.

Our Landscape Performance Series case studies, which quantify the measurable benefits of landscape solutions, were used by our partners to make the case for nature-based solutions on the world stage at COP29. Past LAF Fellows continued to lead important conversations in and outside of the discipline, bringing about advances in practice and positively impacting decisions on climate and carbon, healing spaces, inclusive design, and equity. *Landscape Journal* published an LAF-

led collaborative article and call-to-action for practice-based research.
