Core Landscape Architecture-Oriented Resources for Research

Recommended resources for basic research skills to support practitioner understanding of research methods and theory.

- <u>Landscape Architecture Research: Inquiry, Strategy, Design</u> by Deming and Swaffield, 2011.
 - What's it about? A "practical, single-source guide to successful strategies for landscape architecture research" that provides a framework for advancing better design thinking aimed at practitioners and students.
- "Design as Research in Landscape Architecture" by Nijhuis and de Vries. Landscape Journal, 2020. (Open access)
 - What's it about? Core academic article on research through design "a research method in which spatial design plays the leading role" that explores the concept for both academics and practitioners/design processes.
- 3. Research in Landscape Architecture: Methods and Methodology edited by van den Brink, Bruns, Tobi, and Bell, 2016.
 - What's it about? A more academically oriented but highly useful book on framing and designing research, including priorities for the research within the discipline in coming years as it connects to professional practice.
- 4. <u>Design Research for Urban Landscapes: Theories and Methods</u> edited by Prominski and von Seggern, 2019.
 - What's it about? Book aimed at practitioners with an interdisciplinary lens that explores design research concepts and examples.

 - What's it about? Passionate personal statements about importance of research from leading practitioners, a description of 21 design firms' approach to research, and a call-to-action for research in professional practice.

 - What's it about? Panel presentation and dialogue about the term "design research" with examples of research in action.
- <u>Landscape Review</u> special issue: Convergences of Practice and Research, edited Lawson, 2023 (Open access)
 - What's it about? This issue of the Oceania-based journal focuses on bridging academia and practice, with intriguing provocations followed by valuable examples from practice. "Research, Janus, practice" by Downton is particularly recommended as food for thought.

 - What's it about? Short and accessible LAF guidance on crafting a clear and focused research question, with references and further reading.
